GET INVOLVED WITH ROTAPLAST Chantal Eadeh, CFRS, Executive Director

Chantal shared with our club the history of Rotaplast since its founding in 1992. In its missions, Rotaplast mainly treats patients with cleft lip, palate anomaly, and burned issues. Our speakers attributed these conditions suffered by children abroad to the likes of poor diets, pollutions, smoking, and poor hereditary features. 10 to 12 missions are carried out each year, spending \$1000 per child and treating approximately 1800 children annually. 50% of people are usually denied; patients enroll twice in the program to complete the operations; tracking is done weekly and success stories are shared throughout some beneficiaries' lives. There is always an open invitation to volunteer with Rotaplast, as many Rotarians are volunteers at such missions. To get involved you must pay for your airfare, join a team of medical and logistics staff in San Francisco, CA, and be prepared to carry 30 pieces of medical equipment as your primary task during the mission. more information, contact, or FAQs.
